

Ride Kenya Chyulu Hills



Tailor made Horse Safaris. Minimum 2 guests, maximum 8 guests.

A horse safari with Ride Kenya is an experience one will never forget. The operation is nestled in the foothills of the Chyulu Hills in Southern Kenya, with panoramic views of Mt. Kilimanjaro. The riding safaris have access to 1.4 million acres of incredible riding country with a variety of ecosystems from rolling savannah plains, to acacia forests and volcanic hills.

The focal point is the Chyulu Hills, which rise from 3,000 feet to 7,500 feet and run for 40 miles. Due to the lack of water in the hills, wildlife is more prolific in the low country where we have 38 recorded species of large mammals including all the Big Five – Elephant, Rhino, Leopard and Buffalo, plus the plains game dominated by zebra, wildebeest and eland. There is also a huge variety of bird and plant life to be found in this area.

Enjoy a luxury mobile tented camp, moving between destinations each day, or ride out daily from the comfort of Ol Donyo Wuas Lodge. Game drives and bush walks are the other alternatives. Patrick Stanton and Nicola Young manage Ride Kenya and will be your guide. There is a cook, waiter, general staff and a groom for the horses. They take care of everything you might need

Ride Kenya has a wide range of superb horses available, from thoroughbreds to traditional Southern African "Boerperds" that are acclimatized to riding through wildlife-filled countryside. Children are welcome as there are ponies available.

Accommodation

The tents on our mobile safaris are large and spacious, and you can easily stand up inside. There is an ensuite bathroom with bucket shower and traditional safari style toilet. Lanterns and torches provide the light at night and all linen, soap and towels are provided.

Meal Plan

Full board accommodation, house-wines, beers & soft drinks. Special dietary requirements can be accommodated with prior notice.

- Daily scheduled flight departing Wilson Airport
- By private charter flight, directly to Ol Donyo Wuas airstrip
- By road, four hour drive from Nairobi
